Pastor's Pen

At the beginning of July, I had the pleasure of traveling to the Netherlands for a continuing education seminar. Students in the classroom were from the Netherlands, Hungary, Korea, and The United States of America (which included folks from Michigan, New York, and New Jersey). All of us would be labeled "Reformed" Christians, yet within this small group of maybe 40 folks we had a wide range of understandings of what it means to be Christ followers. While our topic was the Church's Role in Times of Polarization, some thought the church should be a reconciling force, others thought it needed to become more pious and separatist in our faith, and others thought it needed to more boldly proclaim God's call for justice and welcome. This gathering embodied a small portion of the diversity within Christ's body. It calls to mind Romans 12 when Paul says, "So we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another." The Holy Spirit shows up in many ways and places calling Philip to witness to an Ethiopian official, summoning Peter to the home of Cornelius, and sustaining the faithful Jewish followers of Jesus in Jerusalem. In the end, God will sort us out and make things right. We can trust that when that day comes God will act with the heart of a loving parent.
