## Pastor's Pen

With this issue of *News from the Pews* we come to the end of the church's yearly cycle of seasons. First, let me say a word about the seasons in the church year. These seasons are a teaching device to guide us through a faith journey that anticipates Christ's arrival, recalls his ministry, and trains faithful disciples. We begin with Advent, followed by Christmastide, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, and conclude with a celebration of Christ the King Sunday.

Second, this gives us some special days to look forward to in November. The month begins with the observation of *All Saints Sunday*, remembering those we have lost in the past year, celebrating the ways they have blessed us, and reflecting on the communion we still have with all those who have moved into the company of all the saints in light. Later in the month We celebrate the *Christ the King Sunday*, which celebrates Christ who gave up heaven to reveal a kingdom of love and justice. The language of kings and queens may not be relevant to us today, but it invites us to celebrate that Christ is the consummation, the full realization,

of what it is to be human faithfully living in covenant with our creator, and that all life is subject to Christ's standard. Whatever may distract us here, Jesus the Christ is our role, our model, the completion of who we are.

Third, the secular holiday of Thanksgiving arrives just before the first Sunday of advent. Let me offer the following exercise recently taught to me by a Catholic friend as a tool for giving thanks for each day. It can also be used to reflect on the year. Ignatius of Loyola was guided by God to pause during his day and his day with a spiritual exercise called The Examen. It consists of five simple steps:

1. Pause and become aware of God's presence
2. Review your day with gratitude
3. Pay attention to your emotions as you review the day
4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it
5. Look toward tomorrow.

I have found it a helpful tool to quiet my mind at night. It can also be a helpful tool to center us in gratitude at the end of the Christian year and look again toward the coming of Christ.
