Based in Little Rock, Arkansas, United States, Heifer International started with a shipment of 17 heifers to Puerto Rico in 1944. Since 1944, Heifer International has distributed livestock such as goats, bees, and water buffalo, along with training and other resources, to 20.7 million families, or more than 105.1 million people in more than 125 countries. Instead of simply sending cash, donors choose what kind of animal or resources their money will buy. Once the donations are tallied, the children will then vote for which animals they would like to contribute. No doubt there will be many options to help these families break the cycle of poverty - ducks, chicks, rabbits, goats, and more! Stay tuned for an update in our next newsletter. Patricia Lazzara, flutist, has distinguished herself as a soloist, chamber and orchestral musician. She is a three time winner of the Artists International competition in New York City and gave her critically acclaimed New York recital debut at Cami Hall. Ms. Lazzara has performed at Carnegie Hall several times and at the Kennedy Center in Washington DC. Patricia has performed as soloist for the National Flute Association Professional Flute Choir and won first prize in the North Jersey Philharmonic Concerto Competition. Ms. Lazzara is a Miyazawa Flute Artist, (www.miyazawa.com), is the 2007 Winner of the Florida



Flute Association Performers Grant for Advanced Study and a 2004 Winner of the National Flute Association Convention Performers Competition. Ms. Lazzara is also a founding member of UpTown Flutes (UTF), one of the premier flute ensembles performing today.

She attended Carnegie Mellon University and received a Bachelor of Music Degree from the Hartt School of Music where she studied with John Wion, has appeared in master classes with Jean Pierre Rampal, Thomas Nyfenger, Robert Stallman, Trevor Wye and has coached with Jeanne Baxtresser, Michael Parloff and Bart Feller. She also studied with Paige Brook and David Williams.

Darren O'Neill earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from Castleton State University in Vermont and his Master of Arts degree in Music from Montclair State University. Both degrees centered about guitar performance. He earned his Master of Library Service degree from Rutgers University. He is currently Coordinator of Guitar Studies in the John J. Cali School of Music at Montclair State University as well as the Assistant Director of the Morris County Library in Whippany, NJ.

As a member of *Trio Brioso* (flute, viola, and guitar) Mr. O'Neill gave his Carnegie Hall debut in 1997 as the result of winning the Artists International New York Debut Competition that year. As a member of the *Nova Segno Duo* (with Dennis Cinelli), he has performed and recorded on antique instruments from the historic collection at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Mr. O'Neill has recorded three, solo CDs – *The French Connection, American Crossroads,* and *Celtic Keepsake*– and a world premiere recording of flute and guitar suites by Dennis Cinelli (1953-2012) entitled *A Piper's Ayre*. Mr. O'Neill has also had a featured article published in Soundboard (Journal of the Guitar Foundation of America) entitled "A Survey of Select
